# **Business Services Update - Kim Moses**

### **FPM Update:**

The Federal Program Monitoring (FPM) review is complete for the 2023-24 school year. Our district team, led by State and Federal Director Paul Mansingh, met with the CDE Regional Leader, Dawn Edwards, and her team on Friday, April 26, 2024, to review the preliminary FPM findings. The CDE Team expressed appreciation for the attentiveness of our district staff who participated in the FPM review. CDE identified 19 findings that our district teams are working to correct. This is a great reduction compared to the 50 findings during the last review. CDE identified one finding with a fiscal impact of less than \$15,000, which will be rectified without penalty. All FPM results and findings will be shared in an upcoming Board presentation currently scheduled for June 12, 2024.
