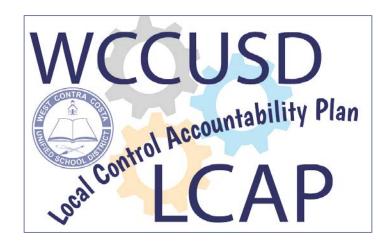

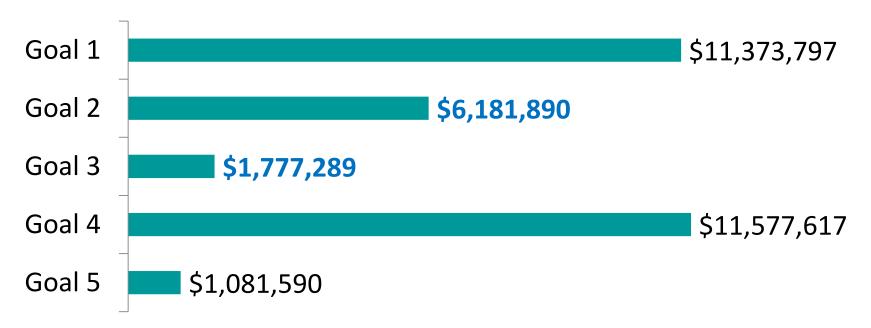

LCAP Student Survey responses of 'often' on CCSS-related questions will increase by 3%

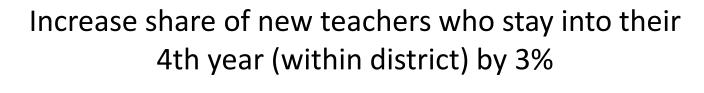

Writing assignment/research project where you used more than one source of information	43%	46%

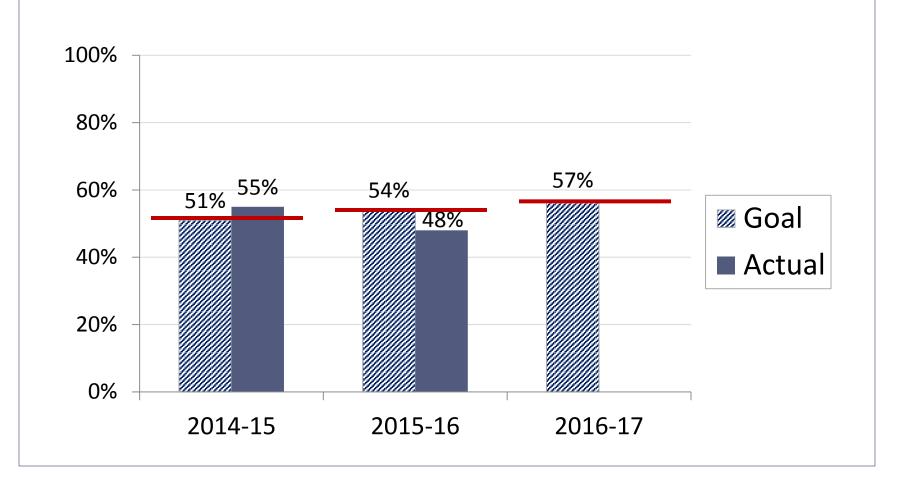


LCAP Student Survey responses of 'often' on CCSS-related questions will increase by 3%

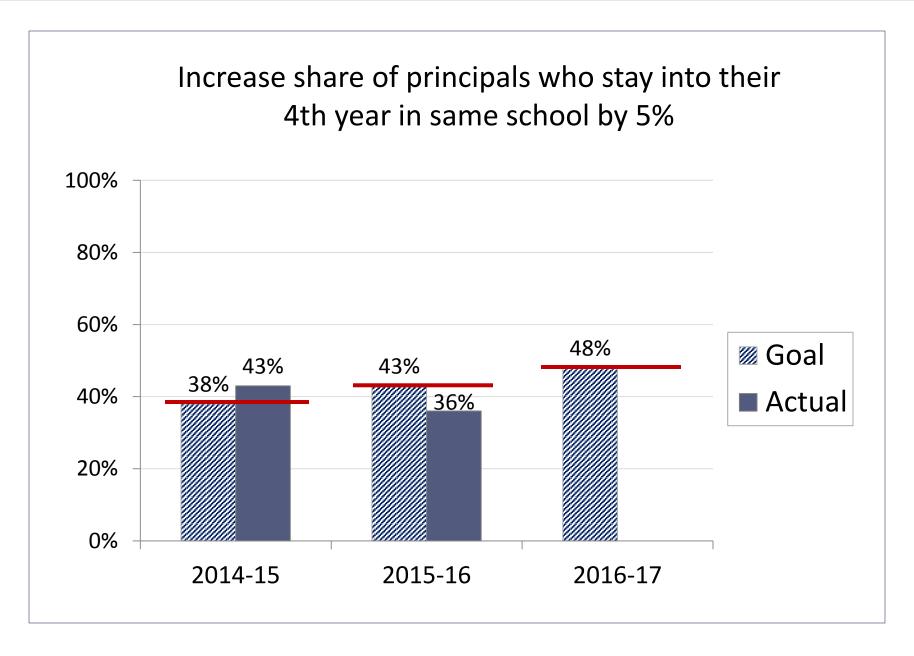

Use computers at school to complete assignment	34%	37%





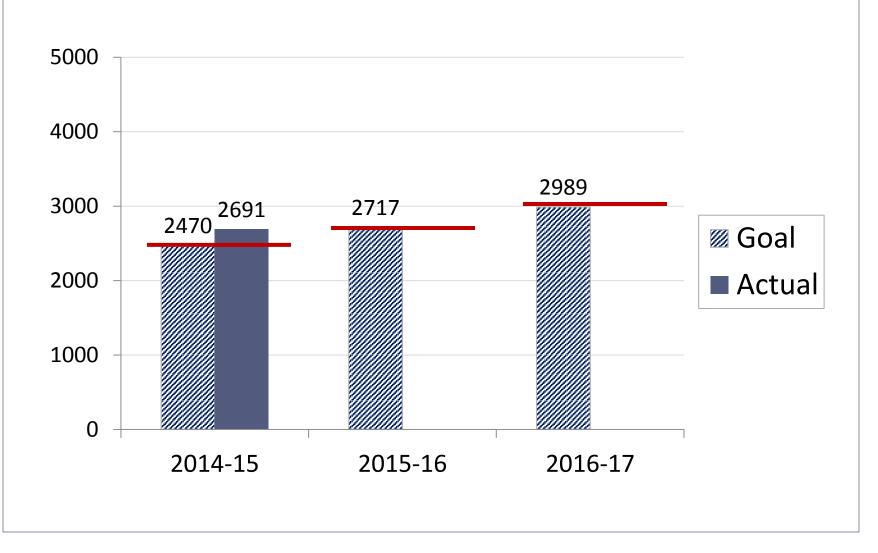






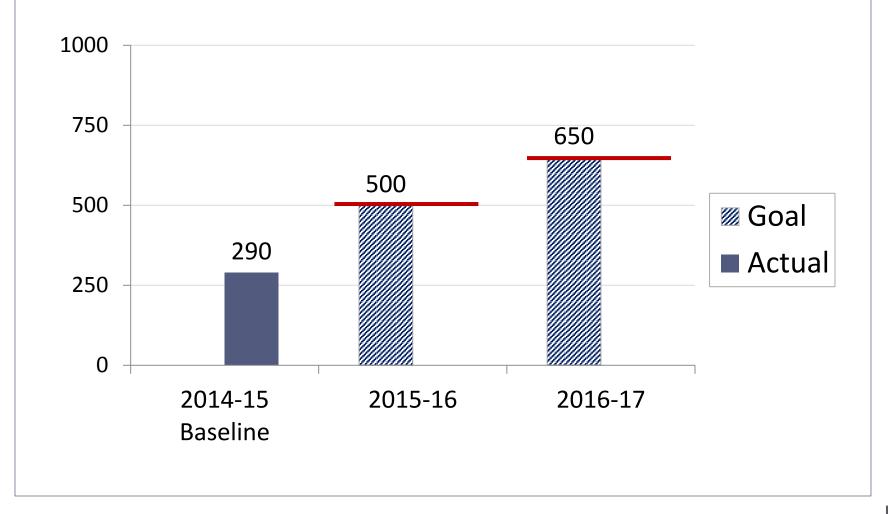








Number of Parent University graduates will increase to 500 graduates
