During the 2012-13 school year:

- Over 63% of ALL De Anza students received Health Center services
- Students receiving Health Center services received an average of 13 points of service
- Health Center staff held 63 conflict mediations, 97% of which were resolved successfully

Huge improvements in De Anza's School Climate Index!

Results from the California Healthy Kids Survey indicate that De Anza's school climate has improved dramatically since 2011, when most youth programming began in De Anza's Health Center. The table below presents De Anza's School Climate Score percentiles from 2011-2013. Among schools with similar demographics, De Anza moved from the 10th percentile in 2011 to the 90th percentile in 2013. The School Climate Index measures supports and engagement; violence, victimization, and substance abuse at school; and incidences of truancy.

The De Anza Health Center is a safe place for all De Anza students to receive free and confidential health services, information, and programming. Our services include: Health Education, Mental Health, Violence and Drug Prevention, Youth Development, Medical, and Sexual Health Services. Our goal is to foster student wellness and academic achievement.

The De Anza High School Health Center was established in June 2007 as a collaborative effort between the West Contra Costa Unified School District and Bay Area Community Resources (BACR). BACR is a non-profit agency whose mission is to support the healthy development of individuals and families in the community.

Services Offered

Youth Development programs are designed to give students the tools necessary to make changes in their communities. Our peer education and leadership development programs train students in public speaking, presentation skills, classroom management, and planning/organization. Additionally, programs such are our peer mentoring program are designed to foster school connectedness.

Violence Prevention The health center is a safe space for ALL students. We provide peer-led classroom workshops on Bullying aimed at fostering school climate. We also offer anger management classes, conduct conflict mediation services and support groups for students who have been victims of or have witnessed abuse.

Mental Health Services include one-on-one and group counseling around issues of anger management, grief/loss, LGBTQ support, selfesteem, depression, substance use/abuse and crisis intervention.

Medical Services include physicals and sport exams, immunizations, reproductive health services including screening and treatment of sexually transmitted infections (STIs), pregnancy testing, and contraceptives.

Health Education Services include comprehensive sex education, pregnancy and HIV/STI prevention, and peer drug education. Additionally, health educators are on site 3 days a week.
