

Lake Elementary - Campus Replacement

- Bridging documents are complete
- Design Build Entity is being selected Budget: \$65.6M

Next Steps

- Design Build Entity's execution of design and construction
 - -Construction timeline will be dependent on phasing

Riverside Elementary - Critical Needs Project

- Soil stabilization scope which will create stable soil and mitigate the need to relocate buildings
- Design documents for soil stabilization are being reviewed by the Division of the State Architect

Budget \$6.9M

- Approval of permits summer construction dependent on agency approval
- Playground realignment project to reestablish outdoor learning / play space post completion of soil stabilization project





FMP Scope of Work

Kennedy High - Critical Needs Project

 Master plan scope includes demolishing the front building, reorienting the campus and using the portables on site as a temporary campus until a larger rebuild could occur

Budget: \$12.2M

Next Steps

- Charter program in portables to be relocated upon the completion of the North Campus Project - anticipated fall of 22
- Confirm program requirements and define scope

Stege Elementary - Critical Needs Project

- Master plan scope included moving school functions to existing portables and demolish Building 1
- Creating a new drop off and portable office location
- Interior improvements to the existing building

Budget: \$2.9M

Final scope is dependent on the outcome of the prioritization of Measure R projects




2016 Prioritization Committee

A Prioritization Committee with 15 members was formed to consider and recommend criteria for project sequencing to the Board.

Prioritization Criteria

- Completed Phases of Design
- Economically Disadvantaged Area
- · Eligible for State Funding
- % of Enrollment ESL, Foster or Low Income
- Lack of Technology Infrastructure
- Over or Nearing Capacity

- Committee considered
 25 criteria generated at site & community meetings
- Committee added, split, combined and narrowed the criteria into final



2020 Community Survey

- Over 2000 responses
- Survey asked
 - The level of importance each of the 2016 criterion
 - New criteria that should be considered
 - The desire for full rebuild projects verses modernizations
- The resulted in 30 new criteria for consideration
